

**PROJECTED TESTING DATES FOR 2011-2012
(Revised September 1, 2011)**

The Virginia Department of Education has provided the testing windows for the state-required testing for the 2011-2012 school year. The dates are included in the list of projected testing dates below. We hope the information in the calendar will assist you in planning other school events for the coming school year.

As required by the No Child Left Behind (NCLB) legislation and local division options, please note the following required testing for the 2011-2012 school year:

- Testing is **REQUIRED** for grades 3, 4, 5, 6, 7 and 8 in **Reading and Mathematics**.
- Testing is **REQUIRED** for high school students enrolled in any class for which there is an associated end-of-course SOL test.
- Grade 5 students will take the Grade 6 Math test if enrolled in an accelerated math class.
- It is recommended that the grade 3 Reading test should be administered over two days; regardless it must be administered in two parts.
- Middle school Content Specific History (U. S. History to 1865, U. S. History: 1865 to the Present, and Civics/Economics) testing will be available in both the Fall AND Spring administrations.
- The grade 8 Science test will be available for the Fall AND Spring administrations and is required for all eighth grade students during either the fall administration or the spring administration, but not both.
- **Grade 5 testing in Science is REQUIRED during the spring administration for ALL students in grade 5, including English Language Learners (ELL).**

The following matrix indicates the dates that should be reserved for testing in school calendars.

August 1-11, 2011	Summer SOL Multiple Choice Testing	All summer school students enrolled for credit in a high school class for which there is an end-of-course SOL test, students who need to retake an end-of-course SOL test for verified credit, and students new to CCPS who have completed courses of study for which there is an end-of-course test for which they wish to receive verified credit.

August 11- September 21, 2011	SOL Expedited Retakes from Summer Administration	Students who failed a Summer 2010 SOL test and need to retake the test for verified credit and any student who did not sit for the summer administration for legitimate reasons
September 19 – November 11, 2012 <u>Grades 1-3:</u> Sept 19 – Oct 14 <u>Pre-K and K:</u> Oct 17 – Nov 11	Fall PALS Screenings	Students in pre-K, K, and grades 1-3. All screenings are conducted by the classroom teachers as scheduled in the individual schools.
October 12, 2011	PSAT/NMSQT Administered by College Board	Juniors register for testing through guidance and are responsible for testing fees. Sophomores will take the PSAT with fees paid by CCPS.
October 17-19, 2011	Fall SOL Multiple Choice Writing Test – Regular Testing and Makeups	Only students who complete the grade 8 English requirement or grade 10 end-of-course English requirement during the fall semester, high school students who need to repeat the SOL Writing test for verified credit and high school transfer students entering in grades 11 or 12
October 20, 2011	Fall SOL Short Paper Writing Test	Only students who complete the grade 8 English requirement or grade 10 end-of-course English requirement during the fall semester, high school students who need to repeat the SOL Writing test for verified credit and high school transfer students entering in grades 11 or 12
October 21, 2011	Make-up for Fall SOL Writing Tests – Short Paper Component	Students as above who missed the scheduled writing tests
