**Summer Session 2017** will offer Academic, Special Education (referral required), ESOL (referral required) classes, and a Fine Arts Academy. **All Academic classes, K-12, are for remediation only.**

To attend Summer Session, students must have been enrolled in grades K-12 during the 2016-17 school year or must be enrolled to attend Kindergarten during the 2017-18 school year.

All grades listed refer to grades in which students were enrolled during the 2016-17 school year.

Registration for all Elementary and Middle School summer classes (academic, enrichment and exceptional education) is restricted to the placement and/or services the students received during the 2016-17 academic year.

**Late registration**, for HIGH SCHOOL students only, will be held on **Tuesday, June 20 and Wednesday, June 21**, from 10:00 a.m. - 2:00 p.m. at Chesterfield Technical Center, 10101 Courthouse Road, Chesterfield, VA. In order to register late, CCPS students must bring a **Late Registration Permission Form from their home school**. Students who register late are not guaranteed class placement. Seats will be offered on a space available basis and students may face closed classes. **Tuition payments at late registration MUST be cash, credit card, or money order payable to CCPS. Checks are not accepted.**

**Non-residents** may register on the final day of late registration for high school classes on a space available basis. The tuition fee is double that of Chesterfield residents. Students are required to bring a letter from their school granting the student permission to take the requested class through CCPS. This letter must state that the home school understands that the CCPS class is for remediation only, and that the student is in good standing with their home school. Proof of immunization must be attached.

## TUITION

Tuition is due in full at time of registration. Payment can be made by credit card during the registration process, or by check, cash or money order paid at student's home school.

A Student is not considered enrolled until payment is made.

### Refund Provisions

- No refunds will be given after 2:00 p.m. on June 16, except for cancelled classes.
- CCPS reserves the right to cancel classes for insufficient enrollment. Students who have enrolled in a class that has insufficient enrollment or a class that has reached maximum enrollment will be notified. Students will have the option of attending another site on a space available basis or receiving a refund.
- A **Refund Request Form** must be completed by parent and turned in at the school where payment was made.
- Refunds will **not** be authorized for students withdrawn for disciplinary reasons or excessive absences.
- Proof of payment must be presented to process a refund.

## TRANSPORTATION

Shuttle transportation will be available from the home school to the designated site. Buses will run only for the beginning of morning classes and will return students to their home school after the dismissal of classes. Students/parents are responsible for transportation to and from home school. ## GENERAL INFORMATION

### Attendance Requirements - Elementary School

Elementary School students do not have an attendance requirement.

### Attendance Requirements - Middle School

Middle School students are allowed only one absence per Middle School session. Students who are absent more than one day per session will be withdrawn.

### Attendance Requirements - High School

High School students may not be absent (excused or unexcused) more than 2 days. Tardies and early dismissals are factored in as a half day's absence.

- Two tardies or two early dismissals will be counted as one absence, regardless of the amount of time involved.
- 2 absences + 1 tardy = withdrawal.
- 1 absence + 2 tardies and 2 early dismissal = withdrawal.

Students who are absent in excess of two days will be withdrawn. There can be NO EXCEPTIONS.

### Credit - High School Only

High school students can earn one unit of credit upon successfully demonstrating subject/content proficiency. These sessions are only for students **repeating** a class. (Exception: H/PE is a hybrid course for repeat and new credit. See additional information under High School course listing)

### Discipline

All Chesterfield County Public Schools' 2016 - 17 Standards for Student Conduct and individual building rules are in effect for Summer Session. Students referred to the Site Coordinator or Principal for discipline violations may be withdrawn from Summer Session. By registering, parents acknowledge and agree to these terms.

### Exams - High School Only

Students are expected to take exams if they are administered to the class. End of Course SOL tests will be given at the high school level.
