SCHOOL COUNSELING NEWS

PROMOTE RESPECT: DO GOOD, BE GOOD

School expectations are reviewed in January. Our school theme of Be Good, Do Good revolves around respect. Respect is the core of these school programs:

Positive Behavioral Interventions and Supports (PBIS), Social/Emotional Learning (SEL), and our House Program. Every day students recite the school pledge, practice school expectations, and earn cardinal tickets for being respectful. Ask your child how cardinal tickets are earned! This is what a cardinal ticket looks like:



Unfortunately, people of all ages face disrespectful behavior. We want to instill the core value of RESPECT in students while equipping them with the proper social skills to react assertively, not aggressively or passively, to all disrespectful behaviors. Assertive reactions empower us to handle uncomfortable or unsafe situations and improve our self-confidence.

Everyone deserves to be respected. If you are aware of disrespectful behaviors, please notify your child's teacher, school counselor, principals, or simply call the school office.
