Frequently Asked Questions

Where are the details explained?

Important information regarding the application, evaluation, and appeals processes can be found in the Admissions and Application packet. This may be accessed online via the Appomattox Regional Governor's School (ARGS) website. Click the *About ARGS & Admission* box, and choose the *Admissions Information* option. Please take time to thoroughly review the information in that document.

How do I apply?

Students who reside in a participating school division apply through the division in which they live. Chesterfield County Public Schools uses an online application process for governor's school and specialty center applications, available at <http://ccpsopportunities.com>. CCPS students will log in using RapidIdentity, while non-CCPS students must create an account. Paper applications are not used in Chesterfield County Public Schools, and all applicants must apply through the CCPS application portal.

How many slots are open this year?

Chesterfield County has a total of 129 allocated slots in grades 9-12 at ARGS. The number of returning upperclassmen (rising sophomores, juniors, and seniors) subtracted from the total number of CCPS slots determines the number of students who will be offered admission. We will have approximately 39 open slots to fill this year.

How are applications evaluated?

The Regional Evaluation Committee, consisting of teams of educators representing the participating school divisions, is trained to evaluate each portion of the student's application. The Regional Core Team of gifted education program administrators representing the participating school divisions and the Coordinator of Admissions oversee the process.

What criteria are used in determining student selection?

The following criteria are set by the Appomattox Regional Governor's School Core Team and Regional Board.

Maximum Points	Category
10	Recommendations (2)
10	Essay
15	Grades From second semester of seventh grade and first semester of eighth grade
5	Course Rigor Determined by number of honors and high school credit courses taken in middle school
50	Audition/Portfolio Review
10	Interview
100	Composite Score (Total Points)

How are students selected for ARGS?

The number of available slots for incoming freshmen from CCPS determines the number of students selected to attend Appomattox Regional Governor's School. Applicants are ranked by composite score in each focus area. Students are chosen for admission based upon focus area openings at ARGS and composite score.

What are the school's hours?

Classes begin at 8:30 a.m. and end at 3:30 p.m.
